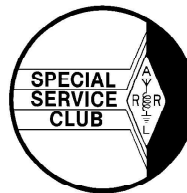

## ARPSC Report

Saturday April 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday Training started out discussing the FLDigi suite of Narrow Band Emergency Messaging Software (NBEMS) in the county EOC. We had 4 operators participating in this training, Ed WS8Y, Jim WD8NWF, Terry N8NYP and Larry KE8HCD. Everyone was feeling pretty confident about setting up and creating messages using FLDigi and everyone was starting to look forward to heading to Benny's for food and debrief when things began to develop rapidly. Our phones started going off with Severe Thunderstorm warnings at about 10:50am, we hadn't been expecting any severe weather so we brought up weather maps to verify what was going on. We immediately started SKYWARN announcements from the radio room and got a net up a few minutes later. Between reports over the air and listening to County Dispatch on the 800 MHz radio, we soon found out something had happened in Dundee and there was considerable damage downtown. Dale WA8EFK and Neil KA8PQH



provided reports from the downtown area. Ed ran SKYWARN net until noon from the EOC radio room, while Terry, Jim and Larry helped with logging, listening to other radio traffic and acting as runners passing messages between Ed and myself as I was entering information into the state MI-CIMS (Critical Incident Management System) and acting as Liaison between EMD



Staff, ARPSC and Dispatch. The county EOC system was activated about 11:45am and most of us stayed until around 1:30pm in case our assistance was needed by EMD. Ed and I stayed until after 2pm relaying messages between EMD and NWS Detroit/Pontiac office. Luckily the overall damage was minimal, there were no injuries reported from the EF-0 Tornado. Overall, on the Amateur Radio end, I felt everything went well, our training and procedures kicked in almost flawlessly to make everything happen. I feel it was a testament to the time and practice that the other operators in the EOC, and those "in the field" have put in. Being able to change gears and go from training to an emergency situation effortlessly and act like the consummate professionals they are in a heartbeat, proves that training and practice pays off! The EMD staff complimented the Amateur Radio response and passed along their gratitude for a job well done!

## River Raisin Repeater Association – 2023 annual meeting

The River Raisin Repeater Association (RRRA) would like to invite you to attend the 2023 annual business meeting. Association officers will be elected, and current / planned business and projects for the association will be discussed (only current members may vote on association business). This is an opportunity to find out where the association has been and to help decide where it is going.

**This year's business meeting will take place on Saturday May 6, 2023, 10:00 a.m. at the American Red Cross 1645 N Dixie Hwy Monroe, MI**

The River Raisin Repeater Association, an independent radio club, was formed in 1971 for the expressed purpose of promoting FM and repeater operation, offering a technical base on the subject, providing a useful communications facility for emergencies, and to develop friendships through a common goal. The RRRA, being an independent radio club, is supported solely by member dues and contributions.

There are five RRRA systems in operation to serve the amateur radio operators of the Monroe County region. Our first repeater, 146.72 (previously 146.73) went on the air in 1971, from downtown Monroe. Today, we operate from our transmitter site near Ida for the 146.72, 224.78, and 442.65 repeaters, along with our 144.93 ax.25 Digipeater. The 444.55 Repeater is located near Erie, and the 442.825 system is in Dundee. Modes such as EchoLink and IRLP have been incorporated into RRRA repeaters and additional modes and features are being explored. Additional information can be found on the MCRCA.org website under the RRRA tab.

RRRA systems are open to use by all licensed amateur radio operators. However, if you are more than a "once in a blue moon" user of the RRRA repeaters, we ask you to consider joining the association. Your participation will help to ensure the ability to operate, maintain and improve these systems while ensuring readiness to support any emergency/ disaster communications needs that may arise.

The River Raisin Repeater Association (RRRA) as an independent radio club is supported solely by member dues and contributions. Dues are \$20.00 per year. Your membership and participation are critical to the successful maintenance and improvement of RRRA equipment and continued services.

Whether you are a current/ past member, would like to join, or are curious and would like to learn more – please join us at the meeting.

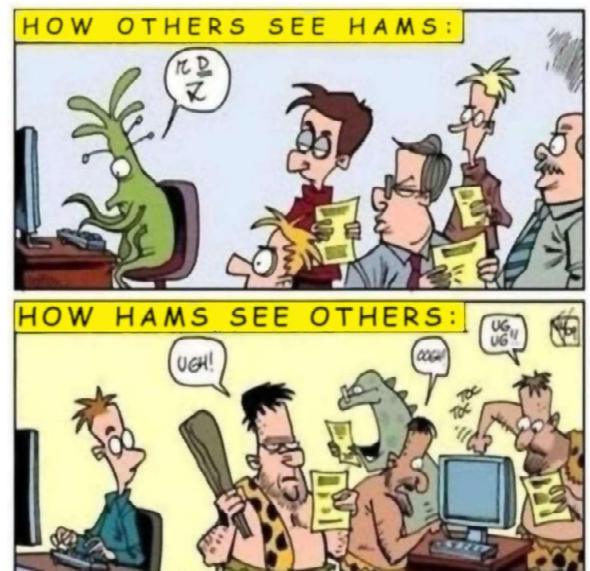

## The FOX is back – 2023 MCRCA Foxhunts

This year – MCRCA will again be hosting a series of foxhunts. Everyone including members, non-members, friends, other organizations, hams and non-hams are invited to join in the fun.

For those not familiar – all hunt teams meet at a given location and receive a pre-hunt brief along with a hunt package. At the designated start time, the FOX begins transmitting. Participating teams begin efforts to locate the fox, which is hidden within a designated area (in this case up to 7 miles away from the start location). Teams earn points according to the distance traveled in locating the fox. The winning team will be the one traveling the least number of odometer miles to find the fox. Each team records distance with the fox when located. Time is not a factor in scoring (unless needed as tie breaker), but the hunt is terminated when the fox stops transmitting after 3 hours.

Minimum Equipment necessary:

A 2M radio or receiver capable of receiving 146.475 MHz FM.

Additional Equipment could include (but is not limited to):

Directional Antenna, Attenuator, Street Map of Monroe County, Compass, Straight Edge, Protractor

### 2023 Foxhunt Schedule

Hunt #1	Saturday May 13, 2023
Hunt #2	Saturday July 08, 2023
Hunt #3	Saturday September 09, 2023



Additional Hunts may be scheduled depending on demand.

### Basic Instructions

- We will meet in the parking lot at Emergency Management Offices 987 S. Raisinville at 08:30 where you will be given a pre-hunt brief (instructions and information specific to the hunt)
- Teams are identified and recorded by the hunt coordinator
- Each team will be given a SEALED envelope – MAKE SURE IT STAYS SEALED (if you open the envelope you will receive same points as someone not finding the fox)
- On the outside of the envelope, write the names/ call signs of all team members. Also record starting mileage on your vehicle to the nearest 1/10 mile (use trip odometer if needed for 1/10-mile increments)
- At 09:00, the FOX will begin transmitting on the Hunt Frequency of 146.475 MHz (transmissions will repeat on a cycle of 1 minute on / 1 minute off for the duration of the hunt)
- After taking initial readings to determine direction to the fox, teams will depart on their quest to find the fox's hiding spot. (remember scoring is determined by least distance traveled so strategy is an important factor – other than the 3-hour hunt limit, time is not a factor so **travel safely and legally**)
- When you find the fox, record your ending mileage (tenths of mile) on the envelope (the one that is hopefully still sealed. And leave the envelope with the fox operator)
- You will be given instructions for a place to go so that other hunters do not see you talking to the fox. We will meet following the hunt for lunch and debrief. Lunch location will be Benny's in south Monroe (15239 S. Dixie) unless otherwise indicated during pre-hunt brief.
- If you DON'T find the fox by the end time of the hunt (12:00), you may open the envelope and proceed directly to the fox if you are close or proceed directly to the lunch location where you will turn in your envelope. (note: the fox will be hungry and departing for lunch shortly after turning off the transmitter)
- Teams choosing to terminate early may open the envelope and proceed directly to the fox to turn in your envelope (or otherwise notify fox/hunt coordinator of termination)
- First place team is responsible for fox duties for the next hunt (second place if first not able to fulfill)
- Teams will be recognized for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place performance for each individual hunt, and the fox will be recognized/thanked for his/her service. All participating teams will be acknowledged.
- In the case of tied mileage for the top 3 teams, time found will be used as the tie breaker. 2<sup>nd</sup> tie breaker will be a flip of the foxhunt chairman's Kennedy half-dollar.

## Responsibilities of the Hunt Teams

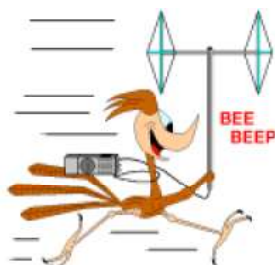
## Hunt Teams MUST:

- Be at start location on time. You MUST be present for pre-hunt brief (08:45) to receive hunt package as required to participate.
- REMEMBER – scoring is based on distance travelled (per odometer) to locate the fox.
- Other than the 3-hour hunt limit, time is not a factor. Hunters must travel safely and obey all speed limits, etc.
- SAFETY is a PRIMARY Concern. Use caution when traveling and when stopping and getting out of the vehicle to take readings. DO NOT create a hazard or place yourself or others in a hazardous situation.
- Respect private property. Do not trespass onto private property.
- Respect public property. Do not damage or otherwise trash public property.
- Remember, this is a FRIENDLY competition, everyone is here to have fun.
- Remember, skills learned and refined could be utilized some day (e.g. Locating emergency beacons, jammers, stuck transmitters, lost RFID tagged individuals)
- LEGIBLY record all requested info on the envelope
- Turn in the envelop to the fox or to the hunt coordinator prior to securing from your hunt efforts (or otherwise notify fox or hunt coordinator of Did Not Find status)
- HAVE FUN and BE SAFE

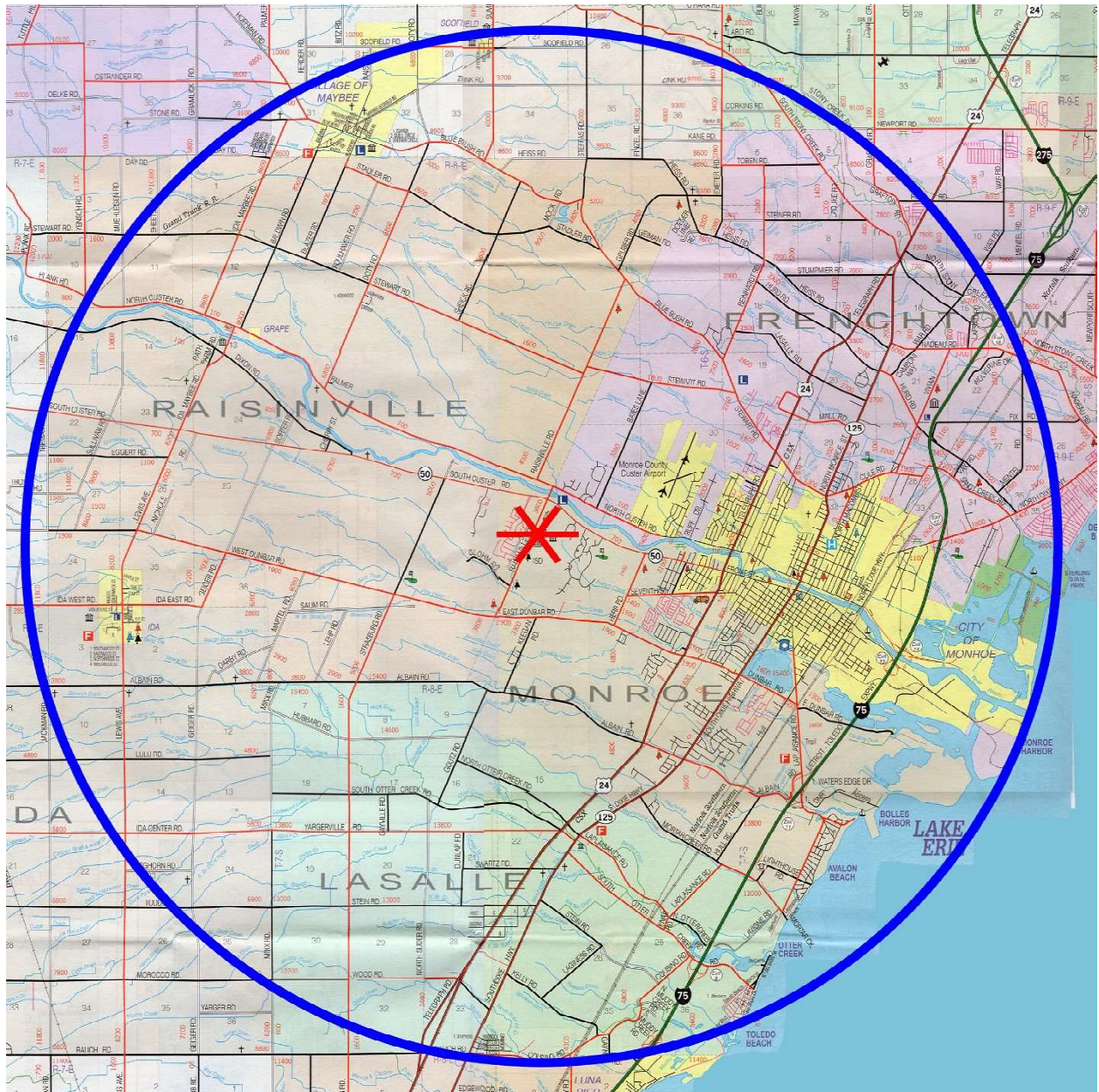
## Responsibilities of the FOX

## The FOX MUST:

- Be an MCRCA Member or must be accompanied by MCRCA member
- Use common sense when locating fox to avoid placing anyone at risk
- Locate fox within area indicated on below map.
  - o Intent is to be within 7-mile radius (as the crow flies) of Emergency Management Office – 987 South Raisinville Rd Monroe, MI 48161)
- Fox beacon MUST be able to be heard at the start location.
- Locate on public non-residential property in a place accessible to the general public during the hunt. Make sure teams can arrive at fox's hideout without violating any hunt rules
- Locate where no admission charge or payment of any kind is necessary in order to access the Fox's hideout
- The fox must be generally visible to hunters without having to enter any enclosure or densely brushed area.
- Once the hunt begins, the fox is to remain stationary, maintaining antenna orientation and transmit power, until such time as the hunt is terminated.
- Transmit on a frequency of 146.475.
- Transmit on a cycle of 1 minute on; 1 minute off for duration of the hunt
- Observe Hunt Time Limits; 9:00 AM to 12:00 PM E.D.T.
- Arrange for distribution at starting point of Hunt Envelopes containing:
  - o Map indicating fox's hideout, shortest possible route (per google maps) (Fox will provide sealed envelopes to Hunt Coordinator prior to Hunt)
- Record/ verify odometer mileage and arrival time for successful hunters at the fox's location.
- Send successful hunters to a prearranged location, away from the fox, so as not to give away the Fox's location

**MALDIVES, 8Q.** Mike, OE3MZC, Laryssa, OE3YLR, Barbara, OE3YCB and Florian, OE3FTA are QRV as 8Q7BZ, 8Q7FZ, 8Q7LZ, and 8Q7MZ, respectively, from Rakeedhoo Island, IOTA AS-013, until April 29. Activity is holiday style on the HF bands and on Satellite QO-100. QSL to home calls.

**CROATIA, 9A.** Special event callsign 9A23WARD is QRV until April 30 to bring attention to World Amateur Radio Day. QSL via 9A3JB.

**TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO, 9Y.** Special event callsign 9Y4WARD is QRV from Trinidad, IOTA SA-011, until April 18 to commemorate World Amateur Radio Day. QSL via LoTW.

**BAHRAIN, A9.** Special event station A91WARD is QRV until April 18 to bring attention to World Amateur Radio Day. QSL via EC6DX.

**SOUTH COOK ISLAND, E5.** Janusz, SP9FIH and Leszek, SP6CIK are QRV as E51WEG and E51CIK, respectively, from Rarotonga, IOTA OC-013, until April 28. Activity is on 40 to 10 meters using CW, SSB, RTTY, and FT8. QSL to home calls.

**SAUDI ARABIA, HZ.** Special event station HZ1WARD is QRV until April 18 to commemorate World Amateur Radio Day. QSL via HZ1SAR.

**SURINAME, PZ.** Look for Rico, PZ5JW to be QRV in the CQ Manchester Mineira CW DX contest. Activity will be on 80 to 10 meters. QSL via EA5GL.

**PALAU, T8.** Ichiro, JH7IPR is QRV as T88UW from Koror, IOTA OC-009, until April 20. Activity is on the HF bands with a focus on 12, 10, and 6 meters, using CW and FT8. This includes being an entry in the CQ Manchester Mineira CW DX contest. QSL to home call.

**GUATEMALA, TG.** Dante, TG9ADM will be QRV in the CQ Manchester Mineira CW DX contest. Activity will be on 80 meters. QSL via EA5GL.

**AUSTRALIA, VK.** Special event station VI6ONE is QRV until April 18 to bring attention to the 2023 Scouts Western Australia's Jamboree style One Camp. QSL via operators' instructions.

**BRITISH VIRGIN ISLAND, VP2V.** Seth, KD9TAW will be QRV as VP2V/KD9TAW from Tortola, IOTA NA-023, from April 17 to 22. Activity will be on 40 to 10 meters using SSB and FT8. QSL via LoTW.

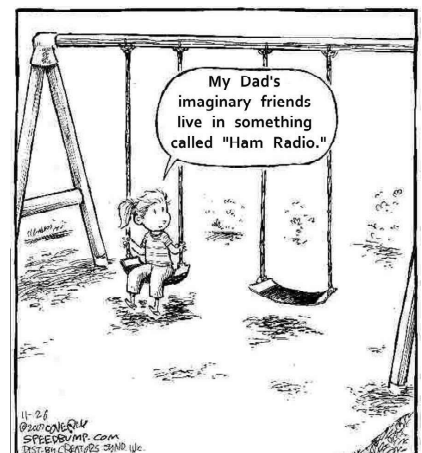
