The sun has been throwing us some good and bad conditions lately. If the bands are lousy, try again in a few hours things can change quickly!

I've been thinking that I should get additional insurance on my ham radio equipment. I'm not sure I'd be happy if I had to file a claim with my homeowner's insurance and deal with them to be made whole. That's why I went to arriinsurance.com to check it out. It looks like their fee is 1.4% of the insured value. (\$20. min) Example \$1500 equipment insured for \$21. \$2500. insured for \$35 etc.

This insurance has a lower deductible and has more flexibility to cover your equipment than a home-owner policy has. Your home policy won't say this: " Insurance for your Ham Radio affiliated equipment is available on a replacement cost basis. Coverage is all risk with few exclusions"

The RRRRA thanks all members very much for your participation in the River Raisin Repeater Association. **We need and appreciate your continued support!!!**

As many already know, the RRRRA is an association of ham operators that initially gathered in 1971 and formed an association for the expressed purpose of promoting FM and repeater operation, offering a technical base on the subject, providing a useful communications facility for emergencies, and to develop friendships through a common goal. The same mission statement applies to this day as the association strives to accomplish the above stated goals.

At the 5/6/23 Annual Meeting RRRRA officers were established as follows: Mike Karmol N8KUF (Pres), Don Fritz Jr N8BZN (VP), Rodney Haddix KD8ZNZ (Sec/Treas), Paul Trouten W8PI (Director), Dale Williams WA8EFK (Director/ Trustee). Summary of Association business was reported, and updates were given regarding efforts completed as well as development projects currently underway.

During this past year, efforts were focused on resolving technical issues and implementation of some performance upgrades. The transmission lines were replaced and repairs were made to the 146.72 repeater after the December windstorm. The February ice storm caused power failure at the Ida site, placing it on generator power. The generator sensor, (installed the previous year), was able to alert low fuel supply. The fuel was refilled and no interruptions or damages occurred. The 146.72 Monroe-Ida crosslink was upgraded. The DC power cabling was reconfigured for the 72 Monroe repeater. Echolink was upgraded. The Digipeater was converted from JNOS to AX-25

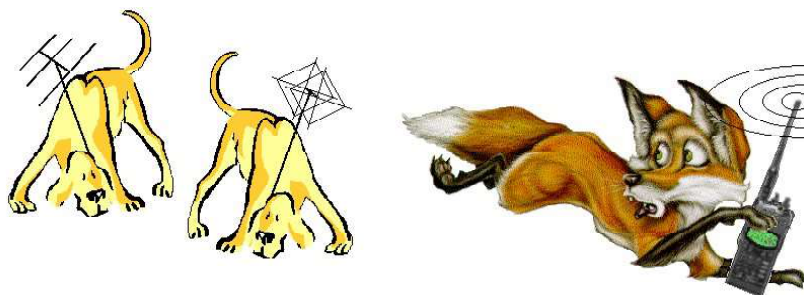

DLARC Radio Library Surpasses 75,000 Items of Ham Radio, Shortwave History

Internet Archive's [Digital Library of Amateur Radio & Communications](#) continues to expand its collection of online resources about ham radio, shortwave, amateur television, and related communications. The library has grown to more than 75,000 items, with new resources including newsletters, podcasts, and conference presentations.

DLARC has recently added [hundreds of presentations](#) recorded by RATPAC, the Radio Amateur Training Planning and Activities Committee, and [dozens of talks](#) given at the MicroHams Digital Conference.

DLARC is adding newsletters from amateur radio groups around the world: the latest additions include 1,400 news bulletins from [Irish Radio Transmitters Society](#) going back to 1998, and more than 600 [newsletters from the Worldwide TV-FM DX Association](#), a hobby club devoted to long-distance television and FM communications. The library has also added newsletters from regional groups across the United States, including the [Anchorage \(Alaska\) Amateur Radio Club](#), [Indianapolis \(Indiana\) Radio Club](#), the [Pikes Peak \(Colorado Springs, Colorado\) Radio Amateur Association](#), and a dozen other organizations. Many of these newsletters have never been posted to the Internet before. All are full-text searchable, and can be read online or downloaded.

Internationally known radio host Glenn Hauser has allowed decades of his radio content to be archived in the DLARC library, including 1,200 episodes of [World of Radio](#), which explores communications from around the world, especially shortwave radio; [Informe DX and Mundo Radial](#), Spanish language translations of World of Radio; [Continent of Media](#), a program about media around the American continent; and [Hauserlogs](#), shortwave listening diaries.

[International Radio Report](#), a program about radio in Montreal Canada and around the world, has also been archived in the library with episodes going back to 2000. Many of these episodes, spanning May 2000 through March 2005, have not been available online for more than a decade, restoring access to important contemporary reporting.

DLARC continues to expand its collection of ham radio e-mail and Usenet [conversations from the early days of the Internet](#), with the addition of nearly 3,500 [QRP-L Digest](#) mailings spanning 1993 through 2004. QRP-L was an early Internet e-mail list for discussion of the design, construction, and use of low-power radio equipment.

The collection of ham radio-related podcasts has reached 5,500 episodes with the additions of [100 Watts and a Wire](#), [The World According to Elmer](#), and 30 episodes of [The Rain Report](#) that were thought to be lost.

The Digital Library of Amateur Radio & Communications is funded by a grant from Amateur Radio Digital Communications ([ARDC](#)) to create a free digital library for the radio community, researchers, educators, and students. DLARC invites radio clubs and individuals to submit material in any format. To contribute or ask questions about the project, contact:

KENYA, 5Z. Vladimir, UA4WHX is currently QRV as 5Z4/UA4WHX. Activity is on the HF bands. His length of stay is unknown. QSL to home call.

WEST MALAYSIA, 9M2. Team 9M4KI is QRV from Pulau Songsong Island, IOTA AS-058, until May 14. Activity is on 40 to 10 meters using SSB. QSL via 9M2YGF.

RWANDA, 9X. Harald, DF2WO is QRV as 9X2AW until May 15. Activity is on 40 to 6 meters using CW and FT8. QSL via M0OXO.

PHILIPPINES, DU. Look for DV1ODC to be QRV on May 14 from the Makiling Forest Reserve Laguan Park, DU-0036. Activity will be on 40 and 15 meters using SSB. QSL via bureau.

ARMENIA, EK. Abie, AB1F is QRV as EK/AB1F from Stepanavan, Lori Marz. Activity is on 20, 15, and 10 meters, and possibly on 80 and 40 meters using SSB. QSL via LoTW.

POLYNESIA, FO. Didier, F6BCW is QRV as FO/F6BCW from Huahine Island, IOTA OC-067, until October 25. Activity is on 80 to 6 meters using CW and SSB. QSL via F6EXV.

LIECHTENSTEIN, HB0. Look for stations HB0/PH0NO/p, HB0/PE5TT/p, and HB0/PD7YY/p to be QRV on May 13 and 14 from at least four different nature reserves. Activity will be on 80 to 6 meters using CW with two stations active. QSL via bureau.

GUINEA BISSAU, J5. Carlos, CT2GQA is QRV as J5JUA until the end of May. Activity is on 15 to 10 meters using mostly FT8. QSL to home call.

BELGIUM, ON. Members of UBA Mechelen are QRV with special event station OS23SOM until May 31 in celebration of the Special Olympics Belgium's annual National Games being held this year in Mechelen. QSL via OQRS.

NETHERLANDS, PA. Special event call signs PA100K, PA100M, and PA100PCG are QRV until June 30 to commemorate the two-way telegraph service that started up from Radio Malabar to Radio Kootwijk. QSL via bureau.
