Final Field Day Results

As you will remember this year's Field Day was very different from those in the past. Due to COVID-19 restrictions large group gatherings were not recommended. So we at MCRCA did as most other clubs and did not set up at a park in tents as usual. Instead we operated from our home stations as Class D or Class E entrants.

Due to temporary rule changes entrants could operate from home and credit their individual scores to their club on choice. As reported in July Hertzian Herald we had nine (9) members send in their scores for a total of 6,409 points.

In December 2020 issue of QST the final national scores were published for club aggregate scores. Just looking at the local clubs in Michigan here is the list by point scores.

PARKing Report

For this years' Earth Science Week, the US affiliate of the World Wide Flora and Fauna operated GYPO; Get Your Parks On. From October 10-18, 2020 eleven stations around the country operated special event 1X1 callsigns from parks, historic places, recreation areas and more.

During this time, I operated mobile using a mag mount on the van with 3-4 Hustler resonators. The radio is an Icom 706 (100watts) Although I operated each day, 2 days were repeats of parks. Some down sides were the weather and traffic on I-75 and I-94. Three time locked up for 30 minutes to 1 ½ hour trying to get to a park or to get home.

Some of the special event stations were very active with over 1200 qso's during the week. I hit just over 300 and visited a couple parks I had not been to in the past (so far, I have activated from 50 parks in 7 states).

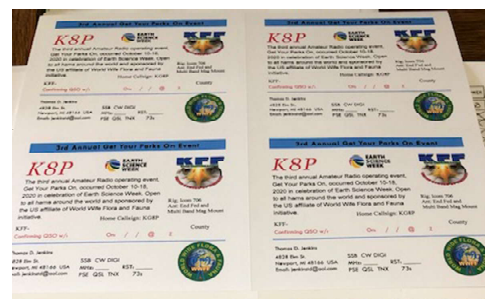
The secret to ham radio is to have fun. Setting up in parks, you meet some nice visitors and park workers. You get to see nature and at this time the color changes. There were deer at Maumee Bay in Ohio, Eagles at Sterling State Park, people on bicycles, dogs being walked, kayaks at lakes and more.

Stations updated their activity on QRZ.com. For me, I would put in photos of the days park and set up. Some days I used an end fed set up, but the mag mount made for quick set up and take down in rain or travel delayed days. You can see mine at QRZ under K8P.

I picked K8P since I have used that call many times in the past and have a template to make QSL cards using Microsoft Publisher. The other stations had calls ending in "G".

How were the bands? Are the bands dead? Is ham radio alive? Aren't we at the bottom of the sunspot cycle? All I can say is I had fun. As a DXer at heart I enjoy the chase and working another park from a park is very satisfying. Two stations with limited power and antennas. I managed to work several European parks in the event. While at Pointe Mouillee, it was a field day of fun working 53 European hams from 19 different countries. Are the bands dead? I must have missed the memo.

Again, the bottom line is to have fun. Operate mobile, fox hunt, digi, cw, ssb....just have fun de KG8P

FRENCH POLYNESIA, FO. Jay, KE6GLA is operating portable as FO/KE6GLA from Bora Bora (OC-067). QSL via his home call.

ST. VINCENT, J8. Oleh, UR5BCP (aka KD7WPJ) plans to operate in the CQ WW DX CW Contest for a few hours as J8/UR5BCP as a single op, low power entry. He will be on location from November 21 to 28. QSL via KD7WPJ.

UNITED NATIONS, 4U. Special event station 4U75UN is QRV until the end of 2020 to celebrate the United Nation's 75th anniversary. QSL via HB9BOU.

U.S. VIRGIN ISLANDS, KP2. Dan, K8RF will be QRV as NP2J in the CQ WW DX CW Contest as a single band, 160 meter entry. QSL via K8RF direct or via LoTW.

ISRAEL, 4X. Special event station 4X0RMN will be QRV from Ramon Crater on November 13 and 14. QSL via 4X6ZM.

MALAWI, 7Q. Members of the Russian Robinson Club Team will be QRV as 7Q7RU near Embangweni until November 18. Activity will be on 160 meters to 70 centimeters using CW, SSB and FT8 in DXpedition mode, and on various satellites. QSL via R7AL.

CHINA, BY. Dale, BA4TB is QRV as B9/BA4TB from Xining city in the Qinghai province. QSL to home call.

INDONESIA, YB. YB0ECT will be a 20 meter, single band, high power entry in the CQ WW DX CW Contest. QSL via W2FB.

PANAMA, HP. Special event station 3E1FP is QRV during the month of November to celebrate the 116th anniversary of Vida Republicana of Panama. Activity is on 80 to 10 meters using CW, SSB, FT8 and FT4. QSL via HP3BSM.

SINGAPORE, 9V. James, 9V1YC has been active using FT8 on 30 meters. QSL via W5UE.

DJIBOUTI, J2. Rene, DL2JRM will be QRV as J28XX. Activity is on 80 to 10 meters using CW and SSB. QSL to home call.

WESTERN SAHARA, S0. S01WS has been QRV on 17 meters using SSB around 1800z. QSL direct.

MALI, TZ. Ulmar, DK1CE will be QRV as TZ1CE from Bamako for a month. Activity will be on 160 to 10 meters using FT8. QSL to home call.
