ARPSC Report

During the Monroe County Fair July 28th thru August 3rd, we will have an additional need for SKYWARN Operators to be on standby during the day and evening should severe weather threaten. EMD and the fair have asked us to be on heightened alert watching the weather. Having operators available in all areas of the county to give a true Ground Truth picture of storms headed towards the Fairgrounds. Also Mark W, Ed K, Jim T and myself will be rotating staffing in the EOC during the evenings that week and there will be an increased need for Net Control Operators as we do not run a SKYWARN net from the EOC. No matter where you are in the county that week, please make sure you have a charged radio with you in case inclement weather pops up, you can check into SKYWARN and help keep everyone at the fair safe.

We also hope to have the trailer on display at the North end of the Fairgrounds that week behind the First Aid Building along with the Regional IMT Trailer. The trailer will not be open or operational during fair, but will be there to help get our name out to more people. There will be a sign on the trailer with a QR code linking to our website for the public to snap and learn about us. If you are at the fair and see someone scanning the QR code, don't hesitate to talk to them and answer any questions they have about amateur radio.

July MCRCA Programs (There are two, both prompted by local happenings).

The first is a brief treatise on how to wind a length of cable so it can be redeployed without tangling. It is a method used extensively in the "Event" industry and can and should be employed to roll up coax, extension cords and even your garden hose. This was prompted by the need to untangle 150 feet of RG8X that was not properly coiled after it was last used.

Number two is Joe Carcia NJ1Q's ARRL presentation on the correct method of soldering a PL-259 onto coax. This was prompted by some club members discovering a loss of about 15 watts across a borrowed 18-inch length of jumper cable because the coax braid was actually not soldered to the coax fittings! Yeah, that is about a watt per inch lost. Joe does a nicely detailed discussion of how to install the connectors so the terminations are clean and electrically sound. It is a good lesson in proper soldering technique.

Both of these topics are well worth viewing and taking the lessons to heart.

12th A.R.R.L. DX Competition—Warning

Rule 11 (Re Disqualifications) Extended and Explained—No Contacts with Countries on European Continent Permitted

THIS notice is addressed to all United States amateurs interested in participation in the Competition for March 15th–17th and 22nd–24th, which was announced in detail on page 38 of February 1940 *QST*. The paramount consideration of our neutrality responsibilities leads the League to rule that no contacts with stations in the European theater of belligerent activities, or with belligerents, or colonies of the belligerents or closed-down neutrals, may be permitted.

Besides reporting on off-frequency stations (all nations), and improper notes, Official Observers this year will report for disqualification, any U.S.A. stations:

- (1) that call or contact *any European station*;
- (2) that call or contact stations in Australia, Canada, India, New Zealand, the Union of South Africa, any British or French colonies or any countries that may be added to the U. S. proclamation of neutrality by Presidential action on or before the contest;
- (3) that call or contact stations in any countries in which amateurs have been temporarily closed down¹ by government edict where amateur licenses were formerly issued in the normal manner.

This self-imposed amateur black-out on Europeans,² and others,² is a precaution necessary in view of the war. Study of the situation with respect to even the European neutrals indicates that so few Europeans could be counted under the rules published last month, that in the general interest of good conduct, to insure complete understanding of this matter by all participants, it was advisable to leave Europe, including European U.S.S.R., completely out of the contest this year. Not only will no credit be allowed for any European contacts or others per (1), (2), (3) above, but calls intercepted and reported as above indicated, will be used to disqualify contestants, if such are made between March 15th and March 24th. We advise amateurs, not only in contest time, but at all times until war matters are again remote from public attention, to adhere strictly to the A.R.R.L. Neutrality Code, and the above recommendations and rules, in the interest of the unrestricted continuance of our amateur radio. Next year, we hope it will be different, and that fewer restrictions will be necessary.
